SAVE A CHILD'S HEART HONOREES



JEFF FROST serves as president of Sony Pictures Television Studios, overseeing all U.S. production and programming for Sony Pictures Television (SPT). Current productions include "The Good Doctor," "The Blacklist," "The Goldbergs," "Outlander" and "Sneaky Pete."

Formerly, as executive vice president, U.S. business affairs for SPT, Frost played a lead role in SPT's overall strategy and negotiations with the studio's broadcast and production partners and talent, overseeing the studio's U.S. business affairs department, including day to day operations as well as strategic counsel on the company's network, cable and syndicated television productions. Frost managed SPT's negotiations between the studio and its partners at networks and production companies, talent, and other outside companies.



DR. HILLEL LAKS, Chancellor Professor of surgery has been a faculty at UCLA since 1981. He came from Harvard/Yale University in Boston. In 1984 he founded UCLA Heart Transplant which is now worldly recognized. In 1986 he started the UCLA Lung and Heart - Lung Transplant Program. He also began the pediatric mechanical assist device program, which is the largest of its kind. In addition, Laks developed UCLA's revolutionary alternate-recipient heart transplant program in 1992, which allows older and higher-risk patients who would not qualify for a heart transplant to receive hearts that otherwise would not be used.

Dr. Laks, actively involved with Save a Child's Heart, will be participating in an upcoming International medical mission and additional professional projects.
